# The main goal of the project

expanding youth participation in public life through the formation of conscious citizenship, strengthening social cohesion, psycho-emotional support, and the development of spiritual, cultural, and national identity



A feature of the initiative is the unification of young people from different regions of Ukraine to create a common space for dialogue, mutual understanding, cooperation and mutual support. The project provides for a series of educational, formational and integration activities that will contribute to the active involvement of young people in public life, the development of responsibility for social processes and the formation of a sense of belonging to a single Ukrainian community.



# 7 principles of conscious citizenship

An important component of the project will be the implementation of the **7 principles of conscious citizenship** (this is an educational concept and lifestyle developed by the Ukrainian Educational Platform, which teaches daily responsibility and is based on the understanding that democracy is not only the right to vote once every few years, but constant participation in creating changes in one's community), which will be integrated into the camp program and will become one of the key components of its implementation.

Within the framework of the implementation of these principles, participants will be able to develop the skills of responsible leadership, team interaction, social activity, mutual respect and conscious participation in the life of the community and the state.



An important component of the camp will be the presence of Bishop Brian Bayda throughout the project. For young people, this is a unique opportunity for direct communication with the bishop and clergy, joint prayer, spiritual conversations and informal meetings. Such closeness creates an atmosphere of trust, openness and support, helping young people feel heard and important in the life of the Church and society.

The presence of the bishop will also be a sign of the Church's lively openness to young people and its readiness to accompany them in the challenges of today, and for the team of the Patriarchal Commission of the UGCC for Youth Affairs, it will be an opportunity to get to know young people from all over Ukraine better.





We are working to make this camp **a place of renewal, growth, and hope for all Ukrainian youth living in Ukraine,** who are experiencing the consequences of war. In order to implement this initiative at the proper level and make participation as accessible as possible to those who need it most, we are open to cooperation and support.

# Speakers

Each day of our camp will be dedicated to a different topic — from spirituality, history and culture to psychology, language and leadership. To explore each of them in more depth, we have invited professional speakers who will share their experience, knowledge and vision. Each day, participants will have the opportunity to listen to lectures, ask questions and reflect on important topics together with invited guests.



# The goals of our camp

- To gather youth from different parts of Ukraine for a shared experience of unity, prayer, and mutual enrichment in the format of a cultural and educational camp.
- To promote the development of leadership and team skills through practical exercises, interaction, and joint tasks.
- To form a readiness for active service in the community and responsible leadership.
- To deepen integration and support between participants, creating a space of trust, friendship, and cooperation.

The location “**Mshanetski Kolyby**” in the picturesque region of Boykivshchyna, where the “**PRO LIS**” camp will be held, was chosen taking into account the security situation, as well as favorable conditions for psycho-emotional harmony, as a place of unique natural beauty, rich in its historical and cultural tradition.



# Number of people

Delegates from each Archeparchy, eparchy, and exarchate of Ukraine are expected to participate to ensure representation of youth from all corners of our Church and country.

The total number of participants in the camp will be **50 young people**.

This will create an opportunity for lively dialogue between participants from different regions, mutual enrichment of experience, and strengthening ties within the youth community.



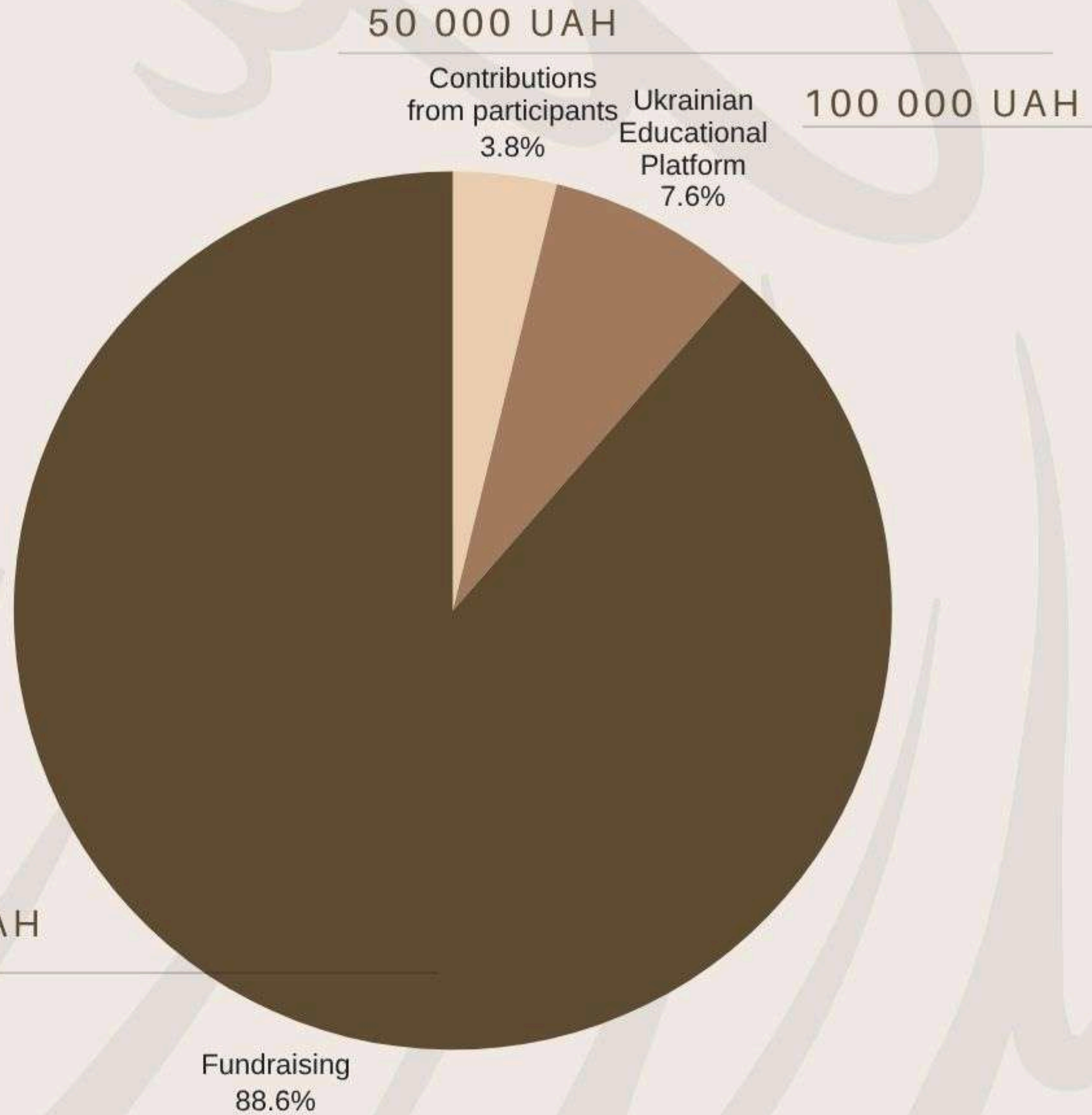

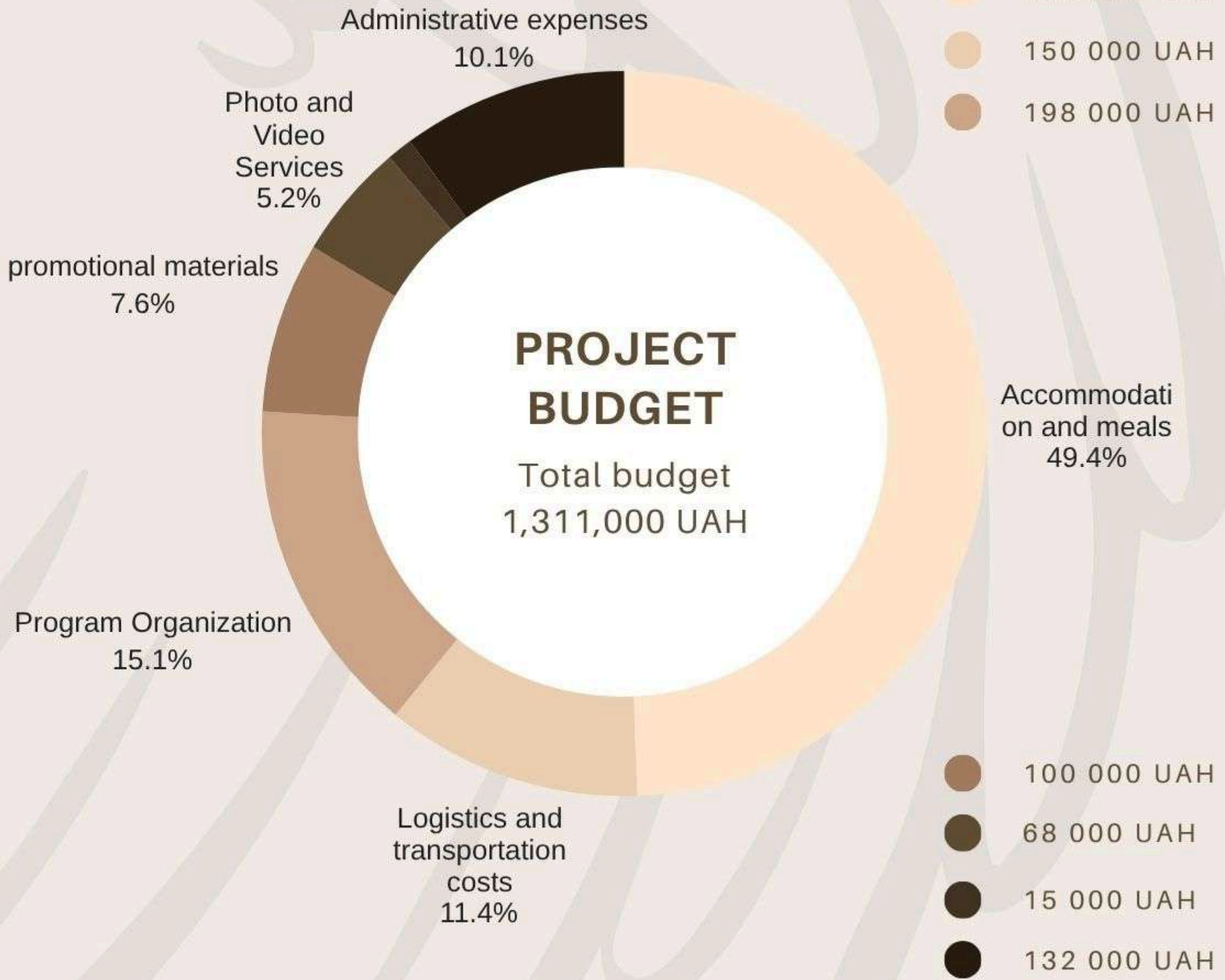
